



Size: 9" finished, 9 1/2" unfinished

Colors: Light & Dark Batiks








Light: Cut 4 @ 3 1/8" square, cut diagonally to make 8 small triangles
Cut 1 @ 5 3/4" square, cut diagonally twice to make 4 large triangles
Dark: Cut 2 @ 5 3/4" square, cut diagonally twice to make 8 large triangles

MAY 2010 - BASKET OF FLOWERS

Size: 8" finished, 8 1/2" unfinished

Colors: Green for basket, florals with cream background



Green: Cut 1 triangle from half of 4 7/8" square
Cut 1 triangle from half of 2 7/8" square
Floral: Cut 1 triangle from half of 4 7/8" square
Cut 2 @ 2 7/8" square, cut diagonally to
make 4 triangles

Cream:

Cut 3 @ 2 7/8" square, cut diagonally to make 6 triangles, use only 5 Cut 7 @ 2 7/8" square

Assembly: Make center square. Make top & bottom center sections, Attach to center square. Make side pieces and attach to center strip.

Sunday, April 11 - 2 p.m.



A book review and ... a challenge for you

"Quilt Challenge: 'What if' ideas for color and design", by Sharyn Craig and Pamela Mostek

A newly published book by Sharyn Craig and Pamela Mostek poses some interesting questions and shows the fabulous results - what happens when a group of quilters is challenged to stretch their creativity?

This is not a pattern book; it is not a 'how-to' book, either, really. The authors have provided an intriguing set of ideas and challenges, and show us the quilts that resulted from their own experiments in setting up quilt challenges. Each challenge uses one block pattern and a color idea. The quilters in the group were asked to take these two minimal starting ideas and run with them . . . and run they do!

For instance, the first challenge illustrated is the simple "Rail Fence" block, along with one fabric for everyone to use - a texture with various shades of purple in it but no other colors. From there, the quilters came up with results ranging from a simple brightly colored child's quilt in traditional rail fence layout, to quilts using variations of the block and using color combinations one might never expect had started with the color purple. Block variations included using only two strips per square up to six or eight; straight strips and curvy strips, parallel strips to sharply angled, and so forth. In other words, the makers were limited only by their imaginations. Some of the quilts look "purple", but most look predominantly green, rust, multi-color, black and bright, and wildly scrappy.

Another challenge illustrated in this book included giving each quilter a small piece of one multicolor print fabric, and they were to use every color in that print in their quilt. This color challenge was combined with the "X" block - and, as in the rail fence challenge, there were many variations of the block used. The quilts were all different, all spectacular.

There are many more challenges posed to this creative group of quilters. I could describe them, but - they are best illustrated by the wonderful photos in the book. You really need to see this book to believe what they came up with!

I enjoyed this book so much, I wanted to share it with my fellow guild members, so I have donated a copy to the guild library. Once you have a chance to check it out, please consider joining me in a challenge of our own. I would love to start a new small group based upon the principles of this book - a challenge based on a block design and a color idea. If you are interested in stretching your creativity in this way, please contact me.
