



# QUILT SHOW DROP OFF



Drop off for quilts is from 10 am to 4 pm on Friday May 3<sup>rd</sup> at the Best Western Plus Ho-6820 S. Cedar St. in Lansing. The only requirement is that the quilts must be folded so the label is on top for fast and easy reading. The label must have your name and the name of the quilt. If it is difficult to determine the top of your quilt and you want a certain side up, please mark it with a small cloth tag that is safety pinned on the top. Please no straight pins. They do not need to be in pillow cases as in previous years, but you can bring them in cases and take the cases home with you. If someone else is picking them up for you after the show we need a signed note at the time of drop-off.

If you are unable to come during this time please make arrangements with Dan Burke or Jean Kaufmann for early drop off at one of their houses.

Outstanding Pieced Quilt, sponsored by Country Stitches Outstanding Appliquéd Quilt, sponsored by Quilting by the River Best Use of Color, sponsored by Everlasting Stitches Best Use of Embellishment, sponsored by Mary Edgar Outstanding Use of reproduction fabrics/historical design, sponsored by Country Stitches Best Original Design or Art Quilt, sponsored by Meijer

For the latter two categories, please help by self-nominating your quilts. If you have a quilt entered into the show that you believe qualifies as either a historical design/use of reproduction fabrics, OR an original design or art quilt, please notify Deb Martens with the name and description of your quilt. This will help our judges to locate the pertinent quilts.

There will be one award given by Meijer for EITHER an original design or art quilt. For purposes of our award, an art quilt will be broadly defined as a quilt made using an artistic style, including abstract, portraiture, and landscapes, and/ or the use of nontraditional techniques and materials. An art quilt may be an original design, but it does not have to be. An art quilt is intended to be hung and viewed on the wall, rather than a bed quilt.

An original design will be defined as the use of a *traditional* block in an *original* layout, an *original* block design used in a traditional or original layout, or any quilt that is *not* based on any published pattern. Original design means NOT using a pattern from a book, magazine, etc., and not merely "tweaking" a pattern by changing its size, colors, etc., or copying another quilt that you may have seen.

Flower Festival features 50 great block patterns in a contemporary art-folk style. Mix and match them in any way you want to get that one-of-a-kind quilt.




**Greenwood Gardens** By Debbie Mumm

String Quilts is an innovative approach to quilt-making that involves creating your own fabric yardage from new or leftover strips of fabric.




Certifiably Crazy The Buggy Barn

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### "Units," Our Newest Project

Here's a new idea for our guild meetings. Instead of Tiny Treats, we'll be making "Units." Each month a simple block based on Pat Speth's 5" block units will be our project. The only color requirement is that one part should be a light fabric and the other part a dark fabric. We encourage everyone to participate so that there will be many Units to win. If possible, you should make 10 Units each month and whoever is the lucky winner will receive all the Units. If just 10 members bring 10 Units each there will be 100 Units to win and we promise that each month all Units will go to just one winner. If we all contribute, that's practically a whole quilt. If the response is large enough, the Units may be divided creating more than one winner.

The May "Unit" (Figure 1) is a half-square triangle. Start with two 5" squares, one a light fabric, the other a dark. Draw a line diagonally on the wrong side of the light one, place them right sides together and sew a scant  $\frac{1}{4}$ " on either side of the diagonal line. Cut on the diagonal line, press open, and square to 4  $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Ta-da now you have two "Units." Repeat 4 more times with whatever light and dark fabrics you have in your stash, or better yet, your scraps. Bring all 10 to the May meeting. Remember, the more participants, the more "Units" you might win.



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The June "Unit" (Figure 2) is a two-patch square. Place a light and a dark 5"- square right sides together. Sew a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on opposite sides of the square. Cut the square in half, so that each side measures 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5". Press open. Make 4 more and bring all 10 to the June meeting.


