The Teal Quilt Project

Comfort, heal, advocate, and educate through community-participatory art

The Teal Quilt Project is coordinated by volunteers and works in partnership with Small Talk (www.smalltalkcac.org), a state of the art center in Lansing, founded "to address child abuse and to empower children to have the courage to heal."

The Teal Quilt Project aims to: 1) create one quilt for each of the c. 300 survivors abused by the now jailed Dr. Larry Nassar, and 2) create public opportunities for members of the greater Lansing area community to individually and collectively heal through participatory artmaking and to learn about child abuse prevention and services.

Some of the survivors of Nassar know about this project and are pleased they will be receiving these physical hugs; they only ask that there be no reference to Nassar on the quilts.

How can you be involved?

To make over 300 quilts we will need lots of help. The Teal Quilt Project is pleased that the Capitol City Quilt Guild has agreed to partner in this effort.

We are accepting donations of new handmade quilt tops (~48" x 60", lap size) as well as blocks of any size. The color teal is often used to represent Sexual Assault Awareness and the pinwheel motif is used to represent Child Abuse Prevention and to remind us that all children deserve great child-hoods. Quilts and blocks can, however, be of any color, size, or pattern. If you need ideas for quilt blocks, instructions for an 8" Pinwheel, a 12" block of scrap rectangles perfect for healing messages, and a heart block like our logo can be found on the Teal Quilt Project Facebook page: https://www.facebook.com/groups/tealquiltproject/ or email: tealquiltproject/ or email: tealquiltproject/ or email:

The Teal Quilt Project—continued

Volunteers are also needed to turn donated blocks into tops and to make quilt backs. Tops will be sent to area long arm quilters. Many community members who are not quilters want to be involved and are donating money, which will be used to purchase batting, backs, binding, and machine quilting services. Many longarm quilters have generously volunteered their services which we have happily accepted, but with over 300 quilts to make, we feel it's only fair to also offer longarm quilters compensation for their efforts. Any money not spent by The Teal Quilt Project will be donated to Small Talk.

To facilitate community healing, the Teal Quilt Project will be holding Community Quiltmaking Events in the greater Lansing area. We are looking for a few volunteer quilters to help at each event. The quilter will bring a sewing machine to make quilt blocks, help non-sewers make blocks using permanent markers, and sew blocks into tops. Check the Teal Quilt Project Facebook page for updates on additional events.

Beth Donaldson will be the program for the September meeting at the CCQG. She will speak on Quilts and Health and The Teal Quilt Project. A representative from Small Talk will also present on their program. If you have any questions, this will be a great time to ask them.

Beth will collect completed quilts, tops and blocks at Capitol City Quilt Guild meetings. There are forms for donating quilts, tops, and blocks, and information sheets at the Vice President's table. The hope is to complete all the quilts in about a year. If you have any questions, feel free to contact Beth at: tealquiltproject@gmail.com.
