The Teal Quilt Project

Comfort, heal, advocate, and educate through community-participatory art

We had our first Quilt-A-Thon at Country Stitches where we tested two new patterns using 2.5" x 4.5" rectangles. Our next Quilt-A-Thon is Saturday, November 10, 9am-4pm at Country Stitches, and everyone is welcome.

Starting in January we will have a Quilt-A-Thon on the second Tuesday of each month, 6-9pm. We have 35 completed quilts and 40 tops (six are at the quilters'). We will begin to distribute quilts via the Grewel Law Firm in early November. Ten quilts (including quilts from our members, Dan Burke, Cindy Mielock, Carolyn Solomon, Liz Cardinal, John Putnam, Denise Macias, and Beth Donaldson) will be on display at The Teal Quilt Project exhibit at the MSU Student Union Gallery. The exhibit runs from October 25 - December 15, 2018. When the exhibit is over, those quilts will also be sent to Grewel for distribution.

I am looking for quilters to finish off tops (quilted only, not tied) and will be bringing tops and backs to the next Guild meeting for anyone who wants to finish them. No deadlines; after the holidays will be fine.

Thanks to everyone in the Guild for being so supportive and for making so many beautiful tops and quilts. We have already heard from survivors how much this means to them.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Well, by now the weather should be more like fall. Less time in the garden means more time at the sewing machine. I think I say that every year but not sure it happens as much as I think it will or as I would like.

We are starting the new year at Guild with our routine programs: Heartwarmers Parade, the fall auction is coming up, and the Holiday Party at the December meeting. These less structured meetings are a great time to interact with each other and meet new people.

I know that there is much concern about the rise in dues but here are a few facts to think about. Our membership is down as some have aged out, won't drive after dark so don't do the winter meetings, some decide not to rejoin and various other reasons. With our rent at \$300/month (and we have an amazing, safe, central place to meet) and our membership at about 130, we spent about \$27/year of each of your dues just for the use of the building. For paper mailings, printing and stamps cost over \$5/year so the extra we ask for doesn't even cover it completely. That left us \$3/month/person for all our programs. Unfortunately, that won't buy very much in the way of programs so we decided to ask for more. We still won't be able to afford to pay for well-known quilters to come every month. And I personally love to see how creative our members are in making guilts just to give away to people they don't know. Members say they want to have more meetings where they learn things, but very few will offer (or accept if asked) to do that for us. We all have little shortcuts or ideas on an easier or better way to do something than the way books/magazines tell us. It would be great if it could be shared with the rest of us. There is much talent in our group. Not too long ago, one of my small groups gave a program on what we do as a group. I would love to hear what others are doing so maybe we can come up with new ideas. If you have suggestions or ideas about programs or semi-local speakers, please contact Lynda the program chair and let her know. Her info is in the newsletter and online. We need your input. We don't know what you all want if you don't tell us and need your input to keep this a viable group. Jean
